

THE WHOLE STUDENT METHOD

A volunteer spirit is just one piece of our whole student method.

To remain in the program, students must volunteer at least four times yearly. These volunteer activities alternate between regular annual and new activities to expose youth to various nonprofits and experiences in our community. Our students should give back as part of the benefits they receive as Young Scholars.

In addition to volunteering, students can partake in over 30 college prep programs before receiving their college scholarship. As recent program college graduate Felix Aranda Jr. states, what differentiates Young Scholars of Bartlesville from



other scholarship programs is "They don't just deposit the money into your bursar and say ok, go to college, buy your textbooks...They actually care about their students. They do so much and are so helpful to pour into their students to ensure that they succeed. That is something that has really inspired me."
